SHELTER TRANSFORMATION GROWTH

During 2022, Open Door Mission underwent significant transformation. Our new facility at 226 Warren Street has allowed us to broaden our services and outreach to those in need. With the increased space, we expanded our shelter capacity to accommodate more individuals, providing not only a safe haven but also additional resources such as a self-shopping food pantry, a clothing closet, community meals, a student meal program, and rehabilitation classes. Despite the ongoing renovations in certain areas, the shelter has remained fully operational and we are committed to serving as many individuals as we can. 



A most heartfelt thank you goes to our donors and grantors, without whom the expansion of our shelter would not have been possible. Expanding our shelter this past year has not just been about providing more beds, but about giving more individuals the opportunity to enter our Life Path program. Individuals get to join the community at Open Door Mission, get stable, and when they are ready move on to their own space. We are grateful for the daily opportunity to reach the most vulnerable and walk alongside them through life transformation. Increasing our capacity also involves collaboration with other local providers. We have so many amazing community partners who partner with us to provide resources for the individual needs of program participants. These include The Wait House, Ascend Mental Wellness, Warren County Workforce Development, Warren & Washington DSS Agencies, and many others.

LIFE PATH PROGRAM

The Life Path Program is a huge part of what makes Open Door Mission unique. In this program, participants are assigned a Life Path Coach and a financial coach and are taken through classes to promote job readiness and independence. We offer help with job skills, resume building, and interview training. Participants are also given the opportunity to connect with mentors to learn different skills in the community.

Maureen Darr, our Program Director says that "one of our most important tasks is to help them identify and reach their goals; to believe that they are capable of doing whatever it is that they set their mind to, and taking the small steps with them to get there."
