MISSION AND VISION

The Open Door Mission began in 1991 as a response to the immediate need for a soup kitchen in Glens Falls, New York. What began with serving meals from an RV gradually expanded to include more services and moved through various locations. In 2018, the mission finally settled into a 46,000 square foot facility at 226 Warren Street.

The Open Door Mission exists to serve people at their point of need, cultivating personal growth and community sustainability. We model our Faith in Jesus by providing practical solutions to physical, spiritual, and relational brokenness.

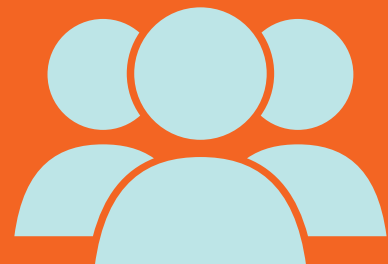

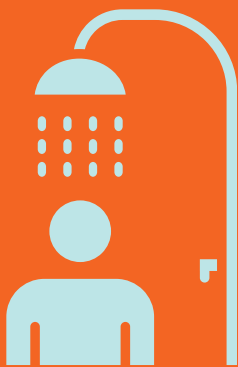

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



CODE BLUE SHELTER

The 2024–2025 Code Blue season marked our busiest yet, serving 361 individuals, a 100% increase from the previous year. As frigid nights brought more people through our doors, our staff and volunteers worked tirelessly to provide warm meals, safe shelter, and compassionate care.

This growth highlights both the rising need in our community and the unwavering commitment of those who support our mission through giving and service.

LIFE PATH PROGRAM

Our Life Path Program — guiding residents through eight transformative steps: Safe, Sober, Stable, Schooled, Skilled, Secure, Settled, and Serving — continues to be a cornerstone of long-term change.

Participation more than doubled this year, from 48 to 100 individuals, reflecting not only growth in capacity but also the trust and hope our residents place in the process. With the guidance of Life Path Coach Jay Corey, participants have set and achieved meaningful goals, from obtaining employment and stable housing to reconnecting with family and faith.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SUPPORT

This year, we welcomed a new Dedicated Domestic Violence Program Caseworker — a major step forward in our commitment to serving survivors of domestic violence and human trafficking.

This role allows us to offer more individualized case management, trauma-informed care, and coordination with local agencies.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

2025 has been a year of momentum for our capital projects.

LAUNDRY ROOM

Construction begins before year's end, thanks to a generous \$30,000 gift from First Presbyterian Church of Glens Falls. The new commercial laundry facility will bring comfort and dignity to residents and guests who rely on us daily.

CHAPEL & MENTAL HEALTH CLINIC

Designs are currently underway, and we're excited to share that we're moving closer to finalizing funding and breaking ground on these essential projects in 2026. Each step brings us nearer to creating spaces that will serve as a refuge for those seeking hope and renewal.

These new areas will provide more than just physical improvements—they'll offer opportunities for spiritual renewal, emotional healing, and personal growth. Every design choice is being made with transformation in mind, ensuring that guests, residents, and volunteers alike have a place where they can find peace, reflect, and rebuild their lives.

At The Open Door Mission, we believe that transformation occurs when people feel safe, supported, and valued—and these projects will help make that possible for years to come.
