BOUND AND DETERMINED. BRANDI GOT A NEW BEGINNING!

"ALL MY PRAYERS WERE ANSWERED."

When Brandi came to Open Door Mission on a cold January night in 2024, she had hit rock bottom. Recently released from prison, she had lost everything: her home, her car, custody of her children, even her clothes. But she had one thing no one could take away from her: a positive attitude.

From her first night in Code Blue, Brandi says, "I was bound and determined to get back on my feet. I was sick of the way I was living. It never ended in a positive result, just me getting into trouble, on probation, in drug court." For the sake of her children and for her own good, Brandi enrolled in our Life Path Program.

children, and she looks forward to getting them back with her. But she knows she could not have succeeded without Open Door — and God.

"I never really went to church until I came here," Brandi admits. "I accepted God and prayed to get my life together. I just wanted everything peaceful, to get an apartment, a safe place. I did my part, and He did His part. All my prayers were answered!"

By supporting Open Door, you were a big part of Brandi's answered prayers. Now on her own, she plans to go to back to school and become a drug and alcohol counselor. "I like paying it forward and

helping others," she says. In the meantime, Brandi refers other women in crisis to the Mission and shares her insights for success in the program.

> "Number one, pray! Reach out for help. Get established with a support network. And do the footwork. It's worth it. You can live a happy life without drugs."

Thanks to you, Brandi is living proof of that.

It didn't take long for Brandi to get back on track. She found a job, applied for housing assistance and got her driver's license. She maintained her sobriety and established a close connection with her children, who were living with their grandmother. "I showed them what I was going to do," Brandi says, "and they're proud of me."

Raised by addicted parents herself, Brandi broke that cycle for her own

Right now, it's just an unfinished basement; not much to look at. But just wait. These stark surroundings are being transformed into a commercial community laundry room that will serve not only Open Door Mission residents, but our community at large.



Lorin Crider, Director of Operations, says, "Many renters have no laundry facilities in their building and can't afford a laundromat. This opens up the opportunity for more people in need to do laundry. It's a big deal. Their kids can have clean clothes, so they won't get teased. And when people come to do laundry, they can learn about the Mission and get help."

In addition, Open Door's kitchen is being renovated with a convection oven and a new dishwasher, making meal prep and cleanup faster and easier for our staff and volunteers.


